\$10K VISA SUBSIDY FOR SKILLED MIGRANTS

The Construction Migration Office is a free service providing dedicated end to end support for WA building and construction sector employers to navigate the process of employing a skilled migrant.

A centralised hub is now available for employers and skilled migrants in the building and construction sector to access all of WA's Migration Services initiatives including the new \$10,000 Construction Visa Subsidy Program.

WA EMPLOYER INCENTIVE PROGRAM

This program is offering financial support to Western Australian businesses that hire apprentices or new entrant trainees. This initiative is designed to encourage the employment and training of skilled workers in the region.

Eligible employers include:

- Businesses employing new entrant trainees
- · Businesses employing apprentices who are below the payroll tax threshold
- Group training organizations (GTOs)
- Employers not currently receiving a Construction Training Fund (CTF) grant
- Local government and government trading enterprises (GTEs)
- Not-for-profit organizations

The incentive consists of two components:

- 1. A base payment of up to \$8,500, determined by the duration of the apprenticeship or traineeship.
- 2. Additional payments for training in state priority areas or for priority groups, such as Aboriginal apprentices/trainees, those with disabilities, individuals living in regional areas, or mature-aged apprentices/trainees (aged 21-30).

Employers can claim these incentive payments at the start, midpoint and completion of the apprenticeship or traineeship.
